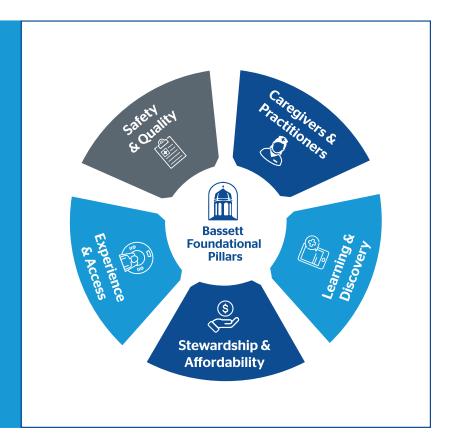

FOUNDATIONAL PILLARS - HOW WE GET THERE

Bassett Healthcare Network's Foundational Pillars are inward-facing priorities on which our caregivers and practitioners are constantly focused. They are the foundation of our organization. We are pleased to present noteworthy accomplishments within each pillar in the year 2021.



CAREGIVERS & PRACTITIONERS

Our people are the single most important asset we have at Bassett Healthcare Network. Our aspiration is to engage and empower our people, thus positioning us to be the very best place to work and practice.



2021: Bassett lays the ground-work for implementing a network-wide Strongline staff safety system. Bassett stands out as one of the few health networks to provide this sort of system for all employees in all areas.



2021: Bassett raises Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) to a high network priority. This included creating a Network DEI Committee, setting measurable goals and beginning a national search for a Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion—a position filled in Spring 2022.



June 2021: Bassett is named a National Caring Science Affiliate System by Watson Caring Science Institute. In conjunction with this distinction, Bassett Medical Center opened a new Healing and Caring Room for its nurses.

CAREGIVERS & PRACTITIONERS



July 2021: Bassett increases the minimum wage across all its locations. This investment of over \$20 million into Bassett's workforce is the first step in a larger review to make Bassett's wages more equitable and competitive.



Fall 2021 and into 2022: Bassett begins a caregiver compensation review to ensure that all Bassett's pay rates are on pace with similar health systems. This review, along with planned periodic updates going forward, will ensure that Bassett employees receive the competitive market rates they deserve.



October 2021: Bassett receives the "Joy in Medicine" Recognition from the American Medical Association for Bassett's multipronged approach to address factors that contribute to clinician stress. This included the formation of the Clinician Peer Support Program of Central New York - the first of its kind in the United States.



Winter 2021: Bassett launches the Bassett Leadership Operating System to shape the network's culture. The BLOS clearly defines plans and goals while empowering caregivers and practitioners to share ideas, concerns and feedback through daily team huddles and lines of communication.

SAFETY & QUALITY

Our commitment to our patients and each other will position Bassett to become a top decile performer in all aspects of high reliability care and be the very best we know we can be for our communities.



2021: New communication channels allow Bassett to implement almost 1,400 new ideas. These ideas cover a wide range of areas, and many aim at increasing the safety of Bassett patients and caregivers.



2021: The Network's central line associated blood stream infection (CLABSI) rate for the year is 1.15 per 1,000 central line days. This is well below the year's goal of reducing rates by 10% - and even exceeds the five year goal of a 1.96.



2021: Bassett continues on its pursuit of a nursing Magnet designation. Bassett's nursing leaders continue to work closely with other network leaders to drive clinical transformation and develop and implement new patient care models and best practices.

SAFETY & QUALITY



2021: The Network's pressure ulcer rate is 0.40 per 1,000 discharges. This is already below the five-year top-decile goal of 0.65.



March 2021: Bassett Health-care Network Partners with New York State to staff mass vaccination clinic at SUNY Oneonta. In the largest coordinated public health operation the region has ever seen, the clinic operated 7 days a week and was capable of administering 1,000 doses of COVID-19 vaccine per day.



Spring 2021: Bassett improves prescription accuracy and safety by fully integrating its e-prescription system. As a result, the network received the SureScripts White Coat Award in October.



Fall 2021: Bassett expands its program to collect unneeded, unwanted or expired medications. In response to environmental and safety concerns, between 2021 and 2022 Bassett doubled its number of drug collection sites.

EXPERIENCE & ACCESS

Our care should result in a remarkable patient experience, regardless of our patients' financial, geographic or personal limitations.



2021: Bassett's Parental Support Program (PSP) integrates parent mental health support into pediatric offices. PSP will be bolstered by a grant from the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation in 2022.



Spring 2021: Bassett's School-Based Health Centers and Oneonta and Cooperstown pediatric clinics expand their telemedicine programs to include pulmonology. This is the next step in an ongoing effort to use telemedicine to connect young patients with specialists across the state.

EXPERIENCE & ACCESS



Spring & Summer 2021 and Beyond: Bassett's New York Center for Agricultural Medicine and Health (NYCAMH) provides farms with onsite vaccination clinics. This removed significant transportation, language and scheduling barriers for farm workers. Between first, second and booster doses, NYCAMH has provided over 630 vaccination shots—a number which continues to climb.



Spring - Fall 2021: Bassett develops and implements a new iRounds application that improves patient experience in real time by creating more meaningful interactions during their hospital admission.
The application was built in Quarter 2, then went live in Quarters 3 and 4, resulting in almost 1,400 rounds being completed by December.



Winter 2021: Bassett's Pharmacy Department partners with facilities and disciplines around the network to provide thousands of COVID-19 vaccines at public clinics. These include clinics at Clark Sports Center, FoxCare Center, Oneonta Health Center, Bassett Family Medicine and Hamilton-Madison Health Center among others.

LEARNING & DISCOVERY

Bassett has deep roots in academics and research and must maintain this unique position through today's research and ongoing commitment to medical education, discovery, learning, and scientific advancement.



2021: Dr. David Strogatz of Bassett Research Institute serves on the National Clinical Care Commission. Created by Congress in 2017, the 24 member investigative committee produced the first national report on diabetes in nearly 50 years.



2021: The Columbia-Bassett Program graduates its 8th class of students. Built on the foundation of Bassett's 80+ year relationship with Columbia University, the Columbia-Bassett Program prepares med students for a future in rural health care. This class is particularly notable for its willingness to work through the pandemic.

LEARNING & DISCOVERY



June 2021: Bassett's Family Nurse Practitioner Residency Program doubles in size and expands to include two community clinics. The program, started in 2020, introduces new nurses to the complexities of rural practice.



September 2021: Bassett collaborates with Masonic Medical Research Institute to improve health. The new partnership with the Utica-based institute will advance research and improve health in Central NY and beyond.



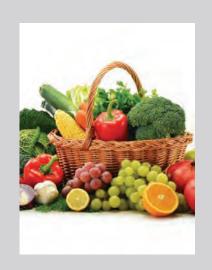
Summer 2021: Dr. Samuel Badalian, chief of Obstetrics and Gynecology, receives a Fulbright US Scholar Award. The prestigious award covers the 2021-2022 academic year and sent Dr. Badalian to Armenia in the fall to establish a urogynecology program.



December 2021: Bassett's Nurse Residency Program is accredited by the American Nurses Credentialing Center. The designation as an Industry-Recognized Apprenticeship Program affirmed the program's value and will help with future recruitment.

STEWARDSHIP & AFFORDABILITY

Bassett is continually focusing on operational efficiency, improving financial performance, and creating more affordable health care for our patients and partners.



2021: Bassett Medical Center continues as a satellite of the Cooperstown Food Pantry. Addressing local food insecurity goes hand-in-hand with Bassett's mission as a health care provider since nutrition is the foundation of good health.



2021: Bassett breaks even financially, closing the \$50 million gap of the last three years.



2021: Bassett steps up its efforts to fight the opioid epidemic impacting its service area. Bassett makes naloxone available without a prescription at its outpatient pharmacies. Meanwhile, it also continues training and coaching network physicians on the use of buprenorphine to increase its patient accessibility.

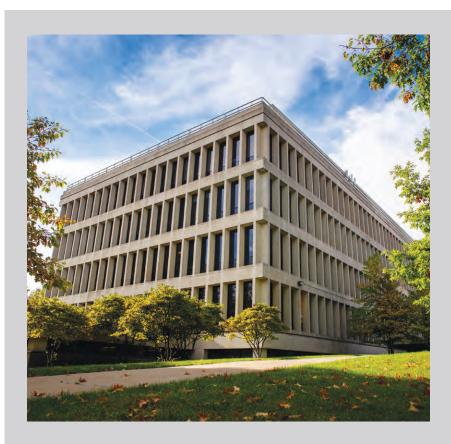

May 2021: Bassett and Optum launch a strategic relationship, giving Bassett new operational capabilities and financial resiliency. In the landmark arrangement, Optum affordably provides Bassett with a broad scope of advanced non-clinical services, freeing the network's resources to invest in patient care.



Fall 2021: Innovations in Bassett's network supply chain lead to over \$6 million in savings. Supply shortages during the COVID-19 pandemic drove lasting improvements in Bassett's Supply Chain Service Center—an achievement recognized by an award from Vizient, Inc. in October.



December 2021: Bassett's earnings before interest, tax, depreciation and amortization (aka EBITDA) and operating margin both hit Bassett's 2021 goals.

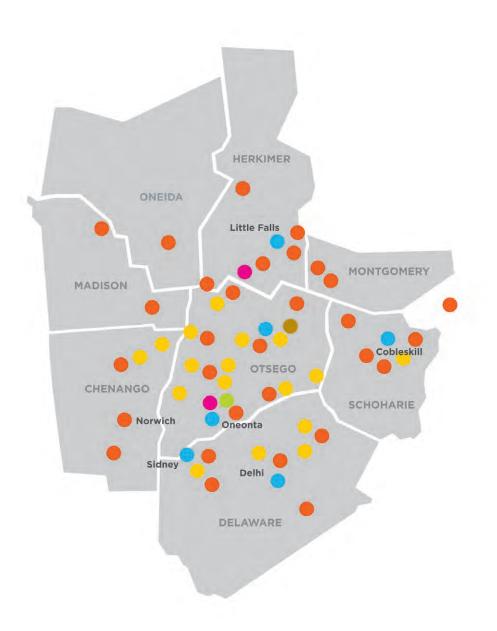
